










CURRICULUM INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

English		Stories about fantasy worlds - Finding Nemo; Shrek Poems on a Theme (Animals) - Fishes in the River; Leap like a Leopard Labels, Lists and Captions - The Picnic
Mathematics		A lot of our maths will be based around our class theme of St George and the dragon. Some of the skills we will use include adding and subtracting, problem solving, telling the time and position and direction.
Science		Our topic this term is teeth. We will learn how to look after our teeth and what foods can harm our teeth. We will explore the teeth of other animals and do an experiment with real rabbits!
PSHCE		This term our topic is Drug Awareness. Our nurse will visit to tell us about medicines. We will learn what medicines are used for and also how to keep them and ourselves safe.
Religious Ed.		We will explore the friends and followers of Jesus and also the lives of St Francis and Mother Theresa, looking at how faith makes a difference.
