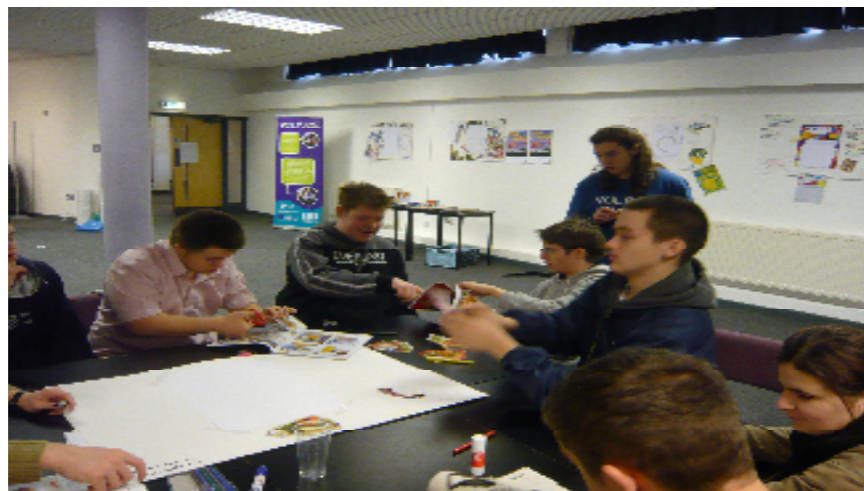
Italian Restaurant Evening coming soon
